INTRODUCTION

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan is a flagship programme under the Ministry of Human Resource and Development, where the higher educational institutions of the country link with villages to contribute to the economic and social betterment of these communities, using their knowledge base. In this vision of transformational change in building an inclusive India, Miranda House, UBA cell is trying to leverage its knowledge base to our partners in five villages. Our partners are:

In this partnership of knowledge, it is imperative to build an understanding of the developmental agenda, interactions with stakeholders, dialogue within the larger community, design societal objectives, improve developmental outcomes and engage community for sustainable growth. Community engagement rests on five distinct practices- reaching out, informing, consulting, involving, collaborating, and empowering. In order to be an effective link, it is essential that we train ourselves in participatory methods and skills and also ensure that we as knowledge partners have a clear understanding of the process of supporting local and partnership learning.

UBA cell of Miranda House plans to offer an online certificate course on 'Community Outreach Program: *'Together we can'* to UBA volunteers, where they will try to understand the nuances of positive collaborative community engagement.

OBJECTIVE

The objective under this course is to impart necessary skills and knowledge for building the foundations for collaborative outreach community partnership and to understand the nuances of community engagement. Communities must be at the heart of any engagement. It is critical to know and understand communities in order to effectively work for transformational change.

The certificate course would focus on linking the term 'community ' to 'engagement'. It would serve to broaden the scope of collectiveness and inclusiveness to ensure considerations are made to the diversity that exists within any community. The course would provide the skill, sensitivity and understanding for purposeful community engagement. Why community engagement, actions for community engagement, principles of community engagement, challenges, sustainability and establishing a "we" relationship are few areas of discussion in this course.

STRUCTURE

The specific objective of the course would be to understand the multi-dimensional nature of community engagement. To that end it would involve the following:

 - Age wise engagement
 - People with specific problems, disease and disability
 - People from diverse backgrounds
5. Implementation of community engagement plans
 - Data collection and analysis
 - Reporting
 - Starting programmes and noting the outcomes
6. Successful methods
 - Role play
 - Case studies
7. The challenges of establishing the “we” relationship.
8. To understand how to engage effectively in a post-COVID scenario

RESOURCE PERSONS

PROF. VIRENDRA KUMAR VIJAY



Prof. Virendra Kumar Vijay is most acclaimed and internationally known professor in biogas and rural technologies. He is the National coordinator-Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, MHRD, Govt. of India. He did his Ph.D from Indian institute of technology in 1998. He has more than 30 years of experience in higher education with multi-disciplinary approach and working with diverse students in Agricultural University for 13 years and another 15 years at IIT, Delhi. Prof. Vijay is actively engaged in research and worked for more than 40 sponsored research and consultancy projects from India and abroad. He has about 150 publications in journals and conferences, 7 books and one lab manual to his credit. Prof. Vijay and his team developed the concept and vision of Unnat Bharat Abhiyan which was adopted by MHRD, GOI in 2014. He is the Indian coordinator of Sustainable Energy and Environment Forum (SEE Forum) working in Asia with head quarter in Japan, General Secretary of Biogas Forum (India). He has got many national awards including young scientist award and Best Engineering teacher award.

PROF. NEERA AGNIMITRA



Dr. Neera Agnimitra is Professor and Head at the Department of Social Work, University of Delhi. She holds M.A, M.Phil and PhD from University of Delhi. She has more than 20 Years of teaching experience. Her research interests and specializations include Community Organization, Ecology and Social Work, Rural and Urban Community Development, Gender Studies, Management of Voluntary Organizations, Social Development, Social Work Education and Disaster Management.

She has received many honors and awards including Distinction in M.Phil. Social Work, University of Delhi (the only Distinction Holder in M.Phil. in the Department of Social Work till date). She has authored numerous research papers in respected peer reviewed international journals. She has presented her findings several national and international conferences and has edited a book titled “Nurturing Practicum: Common Manifesto for Social Work Practice”. She has also supervised many M.Phil and Ph.D. research scholar and received several prestigious research grants. Prof. Agnimitra has held several prestigious administrative positions and she is a Member Secretary, Committee to monitor implementation of Unnat Bharat Abhiyan Programme of the MHRD, University of Delhi

DR. ABHAY SHUKLA



Dr Abhay Shukla is a public health physician, who has been working on health issues in collaboration with people's movements and grassroots NGOs in Western India since over two decades. He is Senior Programme Coordinator at SATHI Pune, along with being a member of the National Health Mission Advisory Group for Community Action (AGCA), as well as having membership of the Core group on Health of the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC). He is one of the national convenors of Jan Swasthya Abhiyan (JSA or People's Health Movement – India).

Dr. Shukla has written several newspaper articles in The Indian Express related to healthcare sector in India. He has co-edited and authored the books 'Review of Health Care in India', 'Report on Health Inequities in Maharashtra', 'Health System in India – Crisis and Alternatives' and 'The Rights Approach to Health and Health Care'. Along with Dr Arun Gadre, he is co-author of the popular book published by Penguin – 'Dissenting Diagnosis' exposing malpractices in the private medical sector in India. He has been involved in developing the framework of community based monitoring and planning (CBMP) of health services at national level, and has mentored the innovative implementation of CBMP in Maharashtra since over a decade. He is actively involved in campaigns for patient's rights, social regulation of the private medical sector, networking among ethical medical professionals, developing a system for Universal Health Care and recently public health awareness during Covid-19.

DR. MIRAI CHATTERJEE



Dr. Mirai Chatterjee is a social worker who leads the Self-Employed Women's Association, SEWA. She joined SEWA in 1984 and was its General Secretary. Dr. Chatterjee has a B.A. from Harvard University in History and Science and a Masters from Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health.

Dr. Chatterjee is the Director of the Social Security Team at SEWA. She is responsible for SEWA's Health Care, Child Care and Insurance programmes. She is currently Chairperson of the National Insurance VimoSEWA Cooperative Ltd and actively involved with the Lok Swasthya Health Cooperative, of which she is a founder. Both cooperatives are promoted by SEWA. In addition, she is Chairperson of the Gujarat State Women's SEWA Cooperative Federation of 106 primary cooperatives with 3 lakh members. She was also appointed a member of National Advisory Council in June, 2010 by Prime Minister of India. Dr. Chatterjee has served on the Boards of several organizations in India, including the Friends of Women's World Banking (FWWB), and the Public Health Foundation of India (PHFI). She was advisor to the National Commission for Enterprises in the Unorganized Sector and is in the Advisory Group of the National Rural Health Mission. She was also a Commissioner in the World Health Organization's Commission on the Social Determinants of Health. She was conferred the Global Achievement award by the School of Public Health, Johns Hopkins University.

DR. BANI ROY



Dr. Bani Roy is Associate Professor, Department of Chemistry, Miranda House. She has done her M.Sc., M.Phil. and Ph.D. from the Department of Chemistry, University of Delhi. An alumna of Miranda House, Bani Roy has done her B.Sc. (Hons) from the College. She was also affiliated to Miranda House while doing M.Sc. Chemistry. Her areas of interest are Inorganic Chemistry, Coordination Chemistry and Environmental Chemistry. She joined the faculty in Miranda House in 1983. She is a recipient of Distinguished Teacher Award from University of Delhi in 2009 and Australian Leadership Award Fellow (ALAF) in 2013. She is a dedicated teacher, deeply interested in students' activities related to and beyond the curriculum. She has been a faculty mentor in several DU Innovation and Star Innovation Projects and also guides summer research projects.

MS. SWEETY PATHAK



Ms. Sweety Pathak is Associate Programme Director of the Maternal and Newborn Health programme and is responsible for the operations of the referral network, as well as the programme's engagement with systems. She holds a master's degree in Public Health from the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine, UK, for which she received the Commonwealth Distance Learning Scholarship in 2011. She has also pursued her Master's degree in Social Work from Tata Institute of Social Sciences. Sweety has about 15 years experience in non-profit organizations working with women and children. She was a program officer at AKSHARA from September 2004- December 2006. In her previous role in SNEHA, she designed and implemented an organization-wide management information system and conducted an in-depth analysis of the information system for building a requirement for SNEHA's Business Intelligence system. Sweety has also worked with the Maternal and Newborn Health programme as a Programme Coordinator. She worked with health systems to improve access to primary health care and emergency obstetric care service and was a site lead for a WHO-funded Implementation Research project.

DR SHAMIM MODI



Dr Shamim Modi is Assistant Professor , Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Mumbai campus. She is Chairperson - Centre for Law and Society, School of Law, Rights and Constitutional Governance. After completing her graduation in psychology from the Jesus and Marry College, Delhi, Master's degree in psychology from Lady Shri Ram College, Delhi, Master of Philosophy (M. Phil.) in Social Psychology from the prestigious Tata Institute of Social Science, Mumbai and L.L.B. from Barkatullah University, Bhopal, she initiated a grassroots level work, in Madhya Pradesh. She along with her husband and local tribals of Betul district and with the active support of Tata Institute of Social Sciences, in 1996 formed an organization called Shramik Adivasi Sanghathan (SAS), which later spread to Harda and Khandawa Districts of MP

Prof. Sanghmitra Sheel Acharya is Professor and Chairperson, Centre of Social Medicine and Community Health, School of Social Sciences, Jawaharlal Nehru University. She holds PG Diploma in Population and Sustainable Development, University of Botswana, Gabarone, Botswana (Southern Africa) and MA, M. Phil, Ph. D from Centre for the Study of Regional Development, School of Social Sciences, Jawaharlal Nehru University. From 2015-18 she was Professor and Director, Indian Institute of Dalit Studies, New Delhi. She has served as Adjunct Associate Professor, Department of Sociology, Faculty of Social Science and Humanities, Ball State University, Muncie, INDIANA US, and also as a visiting faculty at University of the Philippines Population Institute (UPPI), Quezon City, Manila, on fellowship from the Asian Scholarship Foundation, Thailand. She has supervised several M. Phil and Ph.D. doctoral research scholars. She has undertaken research on maternal and child mortality, reproductive morbidity, women's development, health of industrial workers.

DR. PRIYANKA KAUSHAL



Dr. Priyanka Kaushal is an Associate professor at centre for rural development and technology, IIT Delhi. Her research work focuses on biomass-to-energy: Torrefaction, Pyrolysis, Gasification, SYN gas & Polygeneration: CHP, Bio-SNG, FT-Fuel, Hydrogen enrichment etc. Dr. Kaushal has completed her PhD in Chemical Process Technology. She has seven years of teaching and fifteen years of research experience in the area of clean and zero emission technologies. She has 40 publications in peer reviewed Journals/Seminars/ Symposiums/ Conferences. Prior to commencing work at Centre for Rural development and technology, IIT Delhi, Dr. Kaushal had worked in varied capacities in institutes and agencies like, Technische Universität Wien, ECHEM, Institute of Sustainable Energy Environment and Economics, University of Calgary, TERI School of Advanced Studies are to name a few. Her present research work focuses on biomass value addition through thermo chemical treatment.
