As the new session started, Ms. Sakshi Shekhar was elected as the CR of B. Sc.(H) Botany 1st Year on 23 August 2023.




presentation, Dr. Habib engaged in a dynamic question-and-answer session with the audience, further elucidating key concepts and addressing inquiries related to the topic.

Freshers Party- Daffodil organized by Antheia




