

1. <u>SEMINAR ON "CHEMICAL HAZARD AND CHEMICAL DISASTER</u> <u>MANAGEMENT"</u>

Date- 24th April, 2024 Speaker- Prof. Anil K Gupta, Professor,NIDM







The Disaster Preparedness Team organized a distinguished speaker session led by Professor Anil K. Gupta at the National Institute of Disaster Management (NIDM). The focus of the session was on "Chemical Hazard and Chemical Disaster Management." Emphasizing the principle that "prevention is better than cure," Professor Guptaunderscored the significance of awareness and preparedness in mitigating the impacts of chemical disasters. By equipping participants with essential knowledge and strategies for managing chemical hazards, the session aimed to enhance safety, preparedness, and resilience.

Professor Gupta, renowned for his engaging presentationstyle, effectively employed humorous anecdotes to elucidate the complexities of chemical disaster management. This approach not only facilitated a deeper understanding among students but also highlighted the practical importance of proactive disaster management practices. The session underscored that an informed and prepared community is better positioned to avert and respond to potential chemical hazards, ultimately contributing to the broader goal of disaster risk reduction and publicsafety.

The seminar on "Women's Leadership and Role in Disaster Risk Reduction" featured Mr. Rajendra Singh, a distinguished Member of the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) and former Director General of the Indian Coast Guard, as the keynote speaker. Mr. Singh provided valuable insights into the significant role of women in disaster risk reduction and their leadership in shaping effective disaster management strategies. The seminar aimed to highlight successful women-led initiatives and explore how women's perspectives can be integrated into disaster management practices. Major insights from Mr Singh's lecture involved the following-

On August 11, 2024, discussions highlighted that, despite substantial funding and comprehensive plans from the NDMA and state governments, challenges persist in disaster management, particularly in urban flooding and landslides.In Delhi, urban flooding has worsened due to the conversion of water bodies into residential areas. Recent Yamuna floods, driven by climate change, resulted in workspace closures and livelihood losses. Emphasizing professional input in construction, learning from past disasters, and fostering community involvement are crucial for effective disastermanagement. Continuous sharing of experiences and maintaining a culture of preparedness are essential.

Alongside the lecture, the seminar also included the presentation on "Floods in Delhi,2023- A Case Study of Urban Flooding" by the interns of Centre For Environmental Studies and Disaster Management(CESDM).



The Disaster Preparedness Team (DPT) of Miranda House successfully organized its annual




fest, SASHAKTH, on February 5, 2024, from 11:00 AM to 5:00 PM. The event commenced with an inspiring speaker session at 11:30 AM, which continued until 1:30 PM. The keynote address was delivered by Mr. Aditya Pratap Singh, Second in Command of the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF).

Mr. Singh was felicitated by our esteemed teacher and guide, Ms. Rakhi Parijat, who presented him with a gift as a token of gratitude. Mr. Singh emphasized the need for integrating disaster preparedness into the education system, advocating for its inclusion as a subject to foster awareness and vigilance among young leaders. He shared insights from his extensive experience in managing crises, including the Kerala floods of 2018 and the Shaheri building collapse. Mr. Singh described the critical response measures during the Shaheri building collapse, highlighting the importance of staying calm, being alert, and knowing basic safety norms. He provided practical advice for disaster scenarios, such as avoiding lifts during earthquakes and seeking shelter under sturdy objects. Following the speaker session, we conducted a career counseling session led by a senior student from Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU). The session emphasized the importance of ambitious career goals and the value of internships for gaining knowledge and experience. The fest also featured a variety of engaging activities, including a photography competition with the theme "Surviving in Risk - The Disasters of Everyday Life," an online quiz competition titled "Crisis Chronicles - Tales of Preparedness and Response," a treasure hunt named "Rescue Race: First Edition," and cultural performances. The photography competition showcased participants' skills and creativity, while the quiz tested general knowledge and current affairs related to disaster management. The treasure hunt involved finding clues hidden throughout the college, and the cultural performances included solo dance, solo singing, and group dance.

1. <u>SELF DEFENCE WORKSHOP</u>

The Disaster Preparedness Team of Miranda House, Delhi University, organized an engaging two-day workshop on self-defence on November 29th and 30th, 2023. The workshop was held from 3:00 PM to 4:00 PM each day in the sports lawns area and was led by women police officers Anshu and Rinku from the Office of the Deputy Commissioner of Police, Special Police Unit for Women and Children, Nanakpura, Moti Bagh, New Delhi. The event was attended by students from various courses within the college.

The police officers provided an overview of the importance of self-defence, emphasizing that it is crucial for managing intense situations and gaining the confidence needed to control potentially dangerous circumstances. They highlighted that self- defence skills are beneficial for individuals of all ages, promoting confidence, health, positivity, and stress reduction.Following a warm-up exercise, the officers demonstrated several self-defence techniques, including executing effective punches, standing kicks, and defensive maneuvers for use in various scenarios such as public transport. Participants practiced different blocking techniques and learned to target vulnerable areas of an attacker, such as the eyes, nose, and throat, for maximum impact. Techniques for escaping from an attacker's grip and the importance of adopting a bold, loud, and courageous stance were also covered. The workshop underscored the significance of both physical and mental health in self-defence. The involvement of the police officers, embodying the spirit of "Nari Shakti" (Women Power), provided an empowering and invaluable experience for all attendees.




event, fostering greater awareness and preparedness among participants.

futuristic film portrays a scenario where there will be a dearth of oxygen and only carbon will prevail.


1. <u>SEMINAR ON "HILL.FOREST AND A RIVER STORY OF A CITY"</u>

The Disaster Preparedness Team recently organized an essay writing competition centered on


