


On 11 September 2023, the Women's Development Cell, Miranda House conducted a seminar on "*Gendered Violence in South Asian Diaspora*" with guest speaker Sundari Anitha, professor on Gender, Violence and Work at the University of Lincoln, UK. Ms. Anitha's comprehensive research violence against women, encompassing gender, race, border, and migration including domestic, sexual, and university-based violence, provided a profound background for the session.

The session emphasized the heightened vulnerability of women married into immigrated families. The speaker underscored the apprehensions and intimidation faced by these women when contemplating divorce in an unfamiliar country.




The Women's Development Cell, Miranda House, organised a speaker session on **the Women's Reservation Bill** with Ms. Subhashini Ali, former President of the All-India Democratic Women's Association and former Member of Parliament - as the guest speaker. The talk was held on **9 October 2023.**

Ms. Subhashini Ali provided the requisite background for affirmative action through caste-based reservation in India. She addressed the prevailing anti reservation sentiments in our university spaces and the country. She clarified that the problem did not lie in the finding of suitable female candidates but in helping these candidates win. Social realities of deprivation also manifest in the fact that competent women are denied election tickets owing to the deeply patriarchal nature of






Embracing the spectrum of human experience, Women's Development Cell, Miranda House conducted Gumaan, an event focused on neurodivergence, disability, and queerness.






Raahi, the Heritage Walk Society in collaboration with Women's Development Cell, Miranda House conducted a heritage walk to the Roshanara Garden, **on 3rd March 2024**. Yushvita, the walk leader painted an elaborate picture of Roshanara's life- coloured with ambition, aspirations, and scandalous accusations.

The daughter of the Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan and Mumtaz Mahal, Roshanara Begum is often thought to have been overshadowed by her illustrious sister, Jahanara - which shaped her as a person and affected her familial and political relationships. The walk leader traced the life of Roshanara Begum- highlighting her crucial role in the succession politics of the empire and the immense influence she exercised.

We also delved into various themes including the intersection of history and gender, conservation of monuments and invisibilization of the medieval women.


The Department of Sociology in collaboration with Women's Development Cell organised an interactive discussion with **Professor Sonalde Desai** on the topic 'Women and Work'.

The session was headed by **Dr. Jyoti Atwal Limerick**. Dr Jyoti Atwal is Associate Professor of Modern Indian History at the Centre Historical Studies, School of Social Sciences, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi, India & Visiting Professor at UCD School of History, University College Dublin, Ireland.

She specialises in modern Indian history with a focus on gender and socio-political history. Her area of interest includes Irish history with special focus on transnational anti-imperial movements and gender. Through the session we gained deep insight into the intersection of gender and History and the various aspects of the same. Erasure of women from History and subversions of the same were discussed at length.

Ayushmita, a researcher, writer, and trainer, who works in the intersections of gender, race, disabilities with a focus on Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) and invisible disabilities, was able to provide the participants with deep understanding on how to employ an intersectional feminist and decolonial lens to discourse, challenging existing paradigms and advocating for inclusive approaches to research and social program evaluation.

The session helped understand how race and context shape health outcomes and sexual rights, particularly in marginalised communities.

The Women's Development Cell, as part of the annual fest - Gender Mela, organised a "Digital Spaces Workshop" on **15 April 2024.**




