## Students' Perception Study

In the total number of respondents, the share of the courses, namely, B.Sc. (Hons) Zoology, B.A. Program/ Multidisciplinary, B.A. (Hons) Hindi and B.A. (Hons) Philosophy are at the higher end ranging between 9 to $11 \%$ individually in descending order. The share of the courses, namely, B.El.Ed, B.A. (Hons) Economics, Geography, Sociology and Bengali are at the lower end ranging between 3 to $1 \%$ individually in descending order.

## General perception/information

## 1. Accessibility towards economic aid provided by the college

Around $67 \%$ of the total respondents "did not apply" for any economic aid provided by the College. Around $11.4 \%$ of the total respondents "applied but was not granted". Around $19 \%$ of the total respondents mentioned that they "would have applied, but had no information". The students who actually obtained any economic aid provided by the College are very less.

In $50 \%$ of the courses more than $67 \%$ respondents had imperfect information regarding the provision of economic aid. In courses, namely, B.A. (Hons) Sanskrit, Sociology, Political Science, English, Hindi, History, Bengali, B.Sc. (Hons) Physics, Botany and B.Sc. Physical Sciences with Computer/ Multidisciplinary there are at least $20 \%$ of students in each course who have expressed their inability to apply due to lack of information. In this regard, lack of information is mostly expressed to be prevailed in B.Sc. Physical Sciences with Computer/ Multidisciplinary and B.A. (Hons) Bengali with $36.4 \%$ and $45.5 \%$ respectively. Lack of information was not reported at all by B.A. (Hons) Geography and Music. In 10 out of 21 courses, no students have received any grants.

## 2. Membership of any Extra-curricular Society/ Club in college

Nearly $60 \%$ of the respondents are members of any extracurricular society/club.

## Teaching-learning

## 1. Curriculum framework and course content

In response to the question "How would you rate the curriculum framework and course content in terms of width and depth?", around $69 \%$ of the respondents across all the courses has ranked the course content 4 or 5 . Only $7 \%$ students across the courses are not very satisfied with their course content and have ranked them either 1 or 2 .

More than $80 \%$ students of in the individual courses like honours in Bengali, Botany, Mathematics, Music and B.Sc. Life Sciences have ranked their course content either 4 or 5 . But it is the perception of only $50-60 \%$ of students in the individual courses like B.Sc. Physical Sciences with Computer/ Multidisciplinary, B.A. (Hons) in Philosophy, English, Geography and Sociology and B.A. Program/ Multidisciplinary.

## 2. Counselling and mentorship:

While the maximum (more than 64\%) students across the courses have accepted that adequate counselling was provided to help them to choose their optional papers, nearly $19 \%$ students have expressed their need for more support. Around $17.6 \%$ respondents have mentioned the mentoring or counselling was not useful at all in choosing their optional especially generic elective papers.

Academic infrastructure is a main pillar of an educational institute. About $80 \%$ of the respondents have ranked them highly, either 4 or 5 . More than $75 \%$ of the respondents have expressed their satisfaction, giving a higher rank. Similarly, college website and acadME app could able to keep the students updated satisfactorily, more than $72 \%$ of the respondents ranked either 4 or 5 . But in case of washroom and availability of clean drinking water, the college has to work more. The student who has used gym, only $50 \%$ of them perceived it as a high-end facility. The over-all experience of the hostellers could be addressed in future as the college is also concerned about those $17.5 \%$ students who ranked it either 1 or 2.
